A NOTE FROM PASTOR TOM

It's an exciting time of year, school buses are on the road once again taking our children and grandchildren to school and all the activities they are involved. They have so many opportunities to belong to a group of like-minded students. Some of the clubs and activities they can belong to include: Beta Club, Band, Bible Club, Book Club, Choral, Debate, Drama, Ecology Club, Sports programs, E-Sports, Future Business Leaders, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, French Club, Game & Anime Club, Model UN, National Honor Society, ROTC, Philosophy Club, Ruriteens, Spanish Club and STEM to name just a few. We can learn a lot from our youth and John Wesley. Our youth find communities at school to belong, to learn, develop skills and talents and most of all to find comradery. They are working towards their future discovering who they want to become.

John Wesley, on the other hand, was bringing people together to save their souls. Remember in the August Newsletter I shared his charge to newly commissioned circuit riders? Wesley said: *"have nothing to do but to save souls"*. Isn't that why we come to church, to save ourselves, to learn, to seek and become a Disciple of Jesus Christ? John Wesley equipped his circuit riders with the knowledge to organize the communities they came into to bring those who sought redemption to discover a new way of life in Jesus the Christ.

Wesley's small group system has much to teach us today. For example, the model provides for both education (a focus on the mind) and nurture (a focus on the heart). At times we pick one

or the other, but the early Methodist system shows a way to unite them in a context of Christian growth. Additionally, the system offered several levels of commitment and depth. People who wanted to go deeper in their discipleship could voluntarily join a band. However, it makes discipleship a requirement for everyone (class meetings were part of a society which today is a community of faith like ours, Susanna Wesley, a church of believers). Today we make discipleship optional in our churches. We're too busy, just like our youth. We have book clubs, civic organizations, dance groups, lectures or learning events, a list of activities not including entertainment venues we can find time to join. But did you notice in the activities the youth can join it includes Bible Club and Fellowship of Christian Athletes?

It's interesting how people tend to respond favorably to high-commitment Christianity. It's something we're afraid of but is the one act of discipleship that we can seek to emulate that truly saves souls. In many of our churches we assume people don't want to be bothered much, but that may not be the case. As your pastor, I sense this desire in many of you and in those who visit. Many of you came to Susanna Wesley looking for a church that asks them to be committed Christians rather than nominal ones. We show that commitment in our desire to serve and grow our ministries that help those in need. We have begun our school year offering more small groups on Sunday. A place to learn and grow with our mind and heart.

So, as we engage the Wesleyan way we discover he truly developed a system that provides a realistic perspective on the nature of spiritual growth and discipleship. I understand, along with the leadership of your community, that believers are not able to join high-commitment accountability groups because of jobs or family commitment issues and that others are not interested in them. But as we continue on our path towards growth and renewal I remind you of my request in our July newsletter. Your church needs you!! More importantly you need your community of faith. If we are going to become a community of deeply committed Christians we all need to seek and make time to transform our relationships with God and with one another.


So, we have re-launched. Now we need to gain momentum and begin the journey of strategic growth and discipleship. Find a small group, start a home group, make time to deepen your relationship with Christ. Remember what it means to be born again (born from above). Take time to: Reconnect with God; Return home to God, you have been in exile in this world; See again; Stand straight; Let go of what keeps you from God; Receive the gifts of the spirit; Center your life in God; Be compassionate as God is compassionate; Die to the old ways; Recover your true self; Live from the inside out; Die to the false self; and Live into a new way of being

While I, like all pastors and priests, desire that all members of their congregation progress toward the highest level of discipleship, the reality is that a church, a community of faith, will always contain a mixture of believers with a range of interest levels. The Wesleyan system, in a pragmatic way, creates spaces for both types of Christians—the new believer and the high-commitment longtime disciple. Susanna Wesley is a community of faith of deeply committed Christians seeking to support and guide all believers, whether perfect or imperfect, to become a child of God transformed in love.

Opportunities to help the Homeless and those in Need

Gloucester United Emergency Shelter Team **(G.U.E.S.T) Winter Program Update**

Winter is coming and GUEST is working to discern how to care for our homeless population as they move from housing in the local motels to being back on their own. As this transition takes place GUEST is hoping to find the funding to keep the families in the motels. In 2019 Susanna Wesley was one of the housing sites for this program. A lot has changed since then and the Mission Outreach Team is evaluating our abilities to support this program at the same level of effort as in the past.

To be a host site – we need 6 volunteers each night for 7 nights. In addition, due to continuing endemic the spacing of sleeping areas has increased which will reduce the number of individuals we will be able to house. So far GUEST is meeting with potential host sites. Newington and Bridgepoint have agreed so far. They have larger available areas. Another way we will be available is the preparation of meals and volunteering to support the efforts of the other host sites.

There is another way you can help – VOLUNTEER – GUEST needs volunteers to help throughout the season at the weekly host sites. From check in to being present to watch over them as they sleep. The time slots we used were 5:00 p.m. to 11 p.m., 11:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. to 7:30 a.m. To learn more watch for updates as GUEST schedules training. Proposed training dates include Tuesday, November 8, 15 and 29 at 7:00 p.m. To volunteer call 804-792-5046

Red Bird Mission Work Camp - 70 Queensdale Center, Beverly, KY 40913

This is a year-round work opportunity for volunteers in mission and service-minded groups. Work Camp strives to provide home repair for low-income community residents and maintenance for Mission buildings and grounds. Some examples of work projects are roof replacement, small room additions, painting, building porches or ramps, and grounds keeping. Other light duty work is available such as cutting soup upc's, office work, craft and community store helpers, and recycling. A single fee covers the cost of each person's lodging, meals, and materials used. Cost & construction experience is not an issue.

How much will it cost?

Total price per person is:

Adults (ages 10-100) \$425.00 (\$50 deposit plus two payments of \$187.50)

That's only \$10 per week in a designated offering if you began this week

(use an Offering Envelope adding your name and specifying Red Bird Mission Trip)

Youth (ages 6-9) \$212.50 (\$50 deposit plus two payments of \$81.25)

\$5 per week in a designated offering if you began today
