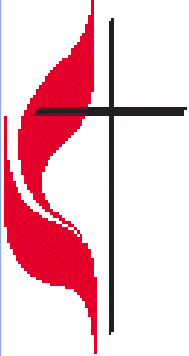

A note from Pastor Tom

It's been 58,121 days since Abraham Lincoln wrote the proclamation making the last Thursday in the month of November a day of Thanksgiving. He opened the proclamation with:

"The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever-watchful providence of Almighty God.

He continues the proclamation reflecting on the civil war and the division in our nation at that time. Today the civil war has been over for 156+ years and division still exist in our nation and world. Just as it has since the beginning of time. But it's in the opening words of his proclamation that I encourage you to focus as your gather this next week for a Thanksgiving meal or a time of fellowship.

There will always be noise in the world. People wanting their way, focused on themselves, seeking adoration in a world fighting one another. My challenge for you this Thanksgiving is to look towards the message of our Lord, Jesus the Christ. Just as Abraham Lincoln shared in the darkness of the civil war he saw the light of our Lord in the beauty of God's creation and in each one of us. Thanksgiving is a time to be thankful for the blessings and grace that had been bestowed upon us. Make it a time of joy filled gatherings, excursions out in your neighborhood, gatherings with your church family and others.

Make time to share the things you are thankful for and when you gather remember the words of the Apostle Paul in his first letter to the church in Corinth. *"Let all that you do be done in love."* 1 Corinthians 16:14 ESV. What would happen if everyone did this? The Apostle Paul reminded the church in Rome, which was in conflict, to *"do all that you can to live in peace with everyone."* Romans 12:18, NLT.

In seven weeks, we will begin collecting worn, tired and discarded t-shirts (adult sizes). This gives us time to go through our t-shirt collections and pull out the ones we haven't worn for a long time or they have tears or holes.

Why - will be collected for the making of jump ropes to put in the 2023 shoeboxes. The shirts are cut into strips and then braided—they make a very sturdy jump rope.

When: A box for the shirts will be in the atrium beginning January the 8th.

October Giving Report

Praise God from whom all blessings flow! We are blessed as we tithe as a community supporting the missions of Susanna Wesley. Serving our community locally, nationally and internationally. We are transitioning to our full budget as we add programs and host more events.

Budget for October - \$19,264.00 (monthly number)

Received - \$19,329.89

Above Budget this month: \$65.89 but we are still over \$9,000 behind for the year

NOTE: We tithe 10% of our giving which goes to our Mission Outreach Team for distribution to ministries and missions in our community

Pray about catching up if you are behind

WHY TITHE?

Did you know that our church used to struggle paying their bills? We used to have finance meetings where we would look at reports showing the money owed and we had columns – one column that said HAVE TO PAY and another column for those that could wait. When we said they could wait that usually meant we were paying things late. The HAVE TO PAY columns were keeping the lights on and paying staff. We were also unable to pay our Church Apportionments which is part of the connectional system to the United Methodist Church. Things were pretty tough.

We thought the answer was to get more money coming in so we tried stewardship programs, letters to the congregation that for the most part begged for funds...just about anything we could think of to bring in money to pay the bills. We brought in our conference treasurer to talk to us and he asked us to pray more about it and get ourselves more focused on God and to be more faithful.

Then we had a minister come in that asked us if we had ever tithed our church's offering. Of course, the first thought was how could we tithe our offering when we couldn't even pay our bills? The Finance Committee along with the Council at the time did decide to give it a try. We voted to tithe 10% of our offering each week and put it in a designated fund to go towards Mission outreach. I think this was the first step in truly making our church a Mission oriented church.

Not long after that something remarkable began to happen! We began to not only pay our bills again but to pay them on time. It felt like it was almost immediately! In the second year we were doing so well that we helped pay Apportionments for other churches as they had done for us before. It was truly amazing! I was the treasurer at the time and it certainly not only made my job easier but gave me a new perspective about tithing in my own finances as well.

That was about 12 to 13 years ago and our church has tithed ever since. We have seen a few tight spots from time to time but we continue to tithe and be faithful and pray that God

will provide and HE DOES! The added bonus is that we are also helping our community as well as mission projects around the world with our 10% tithe.

So, if we can do that with our church finances, imagine what you can do with your own. I have done this with my own finances and I have learned that if you are faithful **GOD WILL PROVIDE!**

Our HVAC Systems have been replaced!!!

Yes, the old units have been removed (34 years old) and the new units have been installed.




The final cost will be a little under \$59,000. Now the challenge is to finish paying for them. We have raised \$37,590.74 so far, leaving a balance of \$21,409.26. In our 2022 and 2023 church budget we are applying \$650 per month towards the payoff of the systems. Many of you are giving a 2nd mile gift towards their payoff also. Pray about making a second mile gift towards the payoff of our new HVAC systems.
