Emergency Christian Homeless Outreach (ECHO)

The purpose of ECHO is to be a Christ-centered, faith-based organization that demonstrates Christ's compassion by providing for the physical, spiritual, emotional, and other identified needs of men, women and children who are homeless or near homeless.

So many times, someone who is struggling with a physical, spiritual, emotional, or other need needs the emotional and spiritual support we can provide by being a kind heart who listens, prays with and or affirms them. Gloucester United Emergency Shelter Team (G.U.E.S.T) Winter Program Update

Winter is coming as the GUEST continues to work to discern how to care for our homeless population. Time and money are running out as the date approaches when those housed in the local motels will have to move out. As this transition takes place, GUEST is planning on keeping the families in the motels, as those who are single leave.

Our Mission Outreach Team has been accessing the ability of Susanna Wesley to house the homeless in the winter program as we last did in 2019. With the increased space requirements and the lack of a sizeable pool of volunteers, the decision was made. Susanna Wesley will be unable to provide housing this year. But, we can VOLUNTEER to help make meals, to serve with other congregations as we come together to support those communities with the ample space necessary to house those needing shelter.

As the program plan comes together, the Mission Outreach Team will keep our community informed. Meal prep will take place in our kitchen and then be brought to the church providing housing. Those interested in volunteering, pray about a shift you would be able to serve. Red Bird Mission Work Camp - 70 Queensdale Center, Beverly, KY 40913

This is a year-round work opportunity for volunteers in mission and service-minded groups. Work Camp strives to provide home repair for low-income community residents and maintenance for Mission buildings and grounds. Some examples of work projects are roof replacement, small room additions, painting, building porches or ramps, and grounds keeping. Other light duty work is available such as cutting soup upc's, office work, craft and community store helpers, and recycling. A single fee covers the cost of each person's lodging, meals, and materials used. Cost & construction experience is not an issue.

How much will it cost?

Total price per person is:

Adults (ages 10-100) \$425.00 (\$50 deposit plus two payments of \$187.50)

That's only \$10 per week in a designated offering if you began this week

(use an Offering Envelope adding your name and specifying Red Bird Mission Trip)

Youth (ages 6-9) \$212.50 (\$50 deposit plus two payments of \$81.25)

\$5 per week in a designated offering if you began today

Children (ages 0-5) FREE
